As a Legal Aid Society lawyer for several decades, Jane represented homeless families individually and in law reform class litigation. She was on the team that established a constitutional right to shelter for homeless families in New York State and enforced it through multiple contempt proceedings. In 2016, she and other Harvard alumni formed the Coalition for a Diverse Harvard in order to oppose allies of Ed Blum who were running for Harvard Overseer. Ed Blum, who Jane will talk about more in a bit, is the conservative activist who brought the case against Harvard which we will be discussing. The Coalition for a Diverse Harvard has grown to 1,200 members. In addition to advocating for ethnic studies and other issues relating to diversity, equity and inclusion at Harvard, Diverse Harvard has become a leading voice for inclusive, race-conscious admissions in higher education.
